SWAY is an oral language and early literacy program that embeds Aboriginal language and yarns within the early learning environment. This program not only supports children's learning and development but it also builds capacity of teaching staff through training and mentoring.

Speech Pathologists work with educators to plan and implement a range of evidence-based oral language strategies in Key Learning Areas including language, communication, listening skills and storytelling.

Local Aboriginal language words are shared throughout the learning experiences in a culturally-appropriate way. This encourages meaningful learning and appreciation of local culture and history and works towards building children's cultural identity and sense of community.
